


Club Corner

Fair Entry Details

Thank you so much to everyone for utilizing the Fair Entry Program. Review your submitted entries here. You may pick up your entry cards July 3-9 in the office 8am-5pm or you get them upon check in at the fair. **DO NOT SEPARATE ENTRY CARDS**. CARDS WILL NOT BE PRINTED TWICE. If the entire entry card is not present with it's corresponding exhibit, it will not be judged. No cards will be printed at the fairgrounds.

All Static entries can be checked in Wednesday, July 10, 5-8pm or Thursday, July 11, 8-10am. All static entries will be judged on Thursday, July 11, from 8:30am until all judging is complete.

If you are not able to enter your own exhibits, you must make arrangements for someone (not 4-H office staff) to enter them for you and also to pick them up on Saturday evening.

State Fair Dog Show

Livestock entries will be checked in on Wednesday, July 10. The schedule is listed in the front of fair book. There is a mandatory livestock meeting at 9:00pm (excluding rabbit and poultry). We will still be utilizing green cards and they can be filled out at check in. Insurance for beef, swine, goats, and sheep will be available for \$7 per head. Cash required, exact change only.

Cloverbuds

Cloverbud exhibits will not be judged as they are display only. Cloverbuds do not receive ribbon premiums. They will receive participation ribbons. These exhibits (including foods) should be brought to the fair to be displayed on July 10.

4-H Code of Conduct

All members agreed to follow the 4-H Code of Conduct when they registered online. This means that you have committed to treating all 4-H members, staff, and volunteers with kindness and respect as well as to be a good sportsman at all 4-H events including the county fair. Please remember at the fair, all judge's decisions are final.
