

	Work with the 4-H officer team in developing the monthly club meeting agenda.
	Attend all meetings and communicate dates and times of 4-H activities from the local K-State Research and
	Extension Office to members and their parents.
Ш	Work with the club's Parents' Committee to identify the volunteer leadership needed for the club. Encourage all
	parents to become involved in the club program.
	Make sure all club volunteers complete the online volunteer enrollment and orientation process.
	Act as a liaison between the club and the local K-State Research and Extension Office. Pick up materials at the local
	K-State Research and Extension Office before each meeting to share with 4-H members.
	Complete necessary reports needed by the local K-State Research and Extension Office.
	Attend leader meetings and/or trainings provided by the local K-State Research and Extension staff.
	Encourage members to participate in 4-H activities beyond the local club.
	Work with the New Family Coordinator in welcoming new families to the club.
	Facilitate ceremonies to celebrate and recognize occasions and accomplishments.
	Delegate tasks and responsibilities to involve as many other volunteers (adult and youth) as you can to complete
	these tasks.

KANSAS 4-H PROJECT LEADER: POSITION DESCRIPTION



PURPOSE:

Provide leadership/teaching in a specific subject matter area to a small group of 4-Hers and assist them to develop life skills.

RESPONSIBILITIES:

All individuals who work directly with youth are required to complete the Kansas 4-H volunteer screening process.

Organize the project group. Communicate with 4-H members and families. Schedule and arrange for the project meetings. Conduct/teach project meetings. Help members complete project exhibit(s). Help members complete project report forms. Attend club meetings when possible.

TRAINING AND ASSISTANCE:

TIME COMMITMENT:

1-year term, October to September. Project meetings should be held at a time, place and frequency that is determined by you and the 4-Hers.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Interest in helping youth.
- Interest in 4-H educational programs.
- Knowledge in or willingness to learn about subject matter to be lead (taught).
- **%** Ability to organize and coordinate.
- **%** Ability to communicate with youth and adults.

MARK ARTS




Mark Arts has agreed to partner with Sedgwick County 4-H youth.

One of the on-site programs Mark Arts hosts, is Art Together. Art Together is a free Mark Arts program that provides families with accessible art education and art appreciation opportunities on the second Saturday of every month from 10 A.M. to 12 P.M. Each Art Together program features three components: story time, a hands-on art project, and a live performance or demonstration. However, each program features a new community partner and theme that aligns with the partner. This keeps the program fun and different each event.

Mark Arts is aiming to host a harvest, agriculture, and/or fall themed Art Together for our October 12 program (the exact theme and participating partners are in the works). 4-H could potentially be a great partner for this program, as 4-H can share valuable info on par with the theme, and Art Together's existing audience could be great demographic to promote 4-H's programs.
