Tips for Outdoor Water Conservation



With hot temperatures, drying winds, and minimal rainfall across the area, drought conditions are quickly worsening in the landscape. As a result, additional water restrictions on outdoor water use loom in the near future. Now is the time to take action, however, and help your landscape & garden

plants adapt to drier conditions. Gradual reductions in water use will help plants most effectively make the transition to decreased water availability, and in summary, increase the likelihood of your landscape making it through periods of drought and water restrictions. **Read More**

Upcoming Medicare Class and Medicare Open Enrollment

Are you new to Medicare and want to better understand the program? Do you have questions about eligibility, signing up, Original Medicare Parts A and B, Medigap (supplement insurance), Part D, Medicare Advantage Plans or how to get help paying for Medicare costs? We can help!

The Senior Health Insurance Counseling for Kansas (SHICK) assistance program through the Sedgwick County K-State Research and Extension office will be hosting a Medicare Options class on August 22nd from 5:30 to 7 pm in the Meadowlark room here in our main office. There is no cost to attend this informative session but you must register ahead of time, and you can do so here: https://lp.constantcontactpages.com/ev/reg/f5tgdk6

If you are already on Medicare, don't forget the Annual Open Enrollment Period for Part D will begin soon. Every year, during the annual enrollment period (October 15 through December 7), beneficiaries have the opportunity to change their Medicare Part D drug plans.

If you would like assistance with this process, you can meet with one of our Medicare counselors to discuss your drug plan options, call the SHICK office in Sedgwick Co (316)660-0126.
